Farming diary

In my last article I mentioned agricultural inflation, with this in addition to everyone's domestic and household costs of living, is truly running out of control. Fuel has risen by 30%, fertiliser by 108% with nitrogen, retailing at over £1,000.00/tonne and phosphate/potash, at £800.00/900.00 a tonne.

We have reduced the amount of fertiliser applied a little, but it reduces the crop output, or yield if taken too far. Obviously our output or sales prices have risen too, but as said before, the whole situation seems a little surreal.

The farm has been a member of Anglian Farmers (AF), a farmer co-operative buying group for many years and this does help to reduce the costs a little through bulk purchasing. AF (originally called Loddon Farmers) has grown from being a local buying group, to now covering a large part of the country.

These inflationary prices of course pale into insignificance, when compared to the horrors currently taking place in the Ukraine, and we truly must be thankful for our settled and safe lives here in the UK.

The farm crops are growing steadily, a little dry maybe, but will soon be showing the ears or seed heads. This is my favourite time of year, when the crops are approaching maturity, but still green. A field of barley blowing in the wind is always a sight to behold.

When drilling the sugar beet in the first week of April, I saw a couple of house martins in the field with me. I haven't seen any more since then and I await their return, along with the swallows and swifts. These always are a sign of spring, along with the beautiful blossoms in the garden and hedgerows.

I hope everybody is enjoying the longer, warmer days, as it has been a long winter.

Alistair's Quick Supper Recipe

Chop one small onion and a clove of garlic finely and add straight into a basic white sauce, cook over a low heat, salt and pepper to taste.

Cook equal quantities of spaghetti, tagliatelle and fusilli, drain when cooked, splash a little olive oil over the pasta, followed by the white sauce mix.

Cook the salmon chunks for about 20 mins, or use large prawns, and serve on a lettuce leaf, as pictured.

Total preparation and cooking time, fifty minutes.



The Night Sky in June



This month I want to introduce you to the dragon in the sky:

Draco is a large constellation and it curls around the little bear, Ursa Minor. If you can find the North Star (Polaris), you should be able to identify Ursa Minor. The map above shows the northern sky on June evenings and should help you to find the dragon. The third star in its tail is called Thuban and it used to be the North Star from 3942 BC until 1793 BC. By then it had moved away from the celestial north pole due to the Earth's precession. This is a kind of slow wobble of the Earth's axis; precession can also be observed with ordinary spinning tops. Today Polaris is our North Star, but around the year AD 21000 Thuban will have again taken its place! By the way, the Egyptian pyramids were built so that one side was facing exactly north and had an entrance passage through which Thuban would shine its light.
