Editorial

Dear Reader,

I was curious as to what 'Norfolk Day' is all about, so I did some research. This is what Norfolk Day is celebrating:

The history of Norfolk Day began more than 300,000 years ago when humans first arrived in Norfolk. The world has since undergone many historical and technological shifts, yet Norfolk continued to host people on its soil.

The modern history of Norfolk began in the Roman Era. Since then, Norfolk has witnessed many historical moments. The county was not always under the British flag. It has changed hands many times with multiple wars being fought for its control. Norfolk was a part of the Roman Empire, Kingdom of the East Angles, followed by the Earldom of Harold I of England, and then finally to England in the Middle Ages. Despite the wars and long history of changing hands, Norfolk continued to be one of the most important markets and agrarian producers in the country. Norfolk also boasts of many English heroes.

By the late 16th century, Norwich had become the second-largest city in England. However tragically, more than one-third of its population died in the plague epidemic of 1579. Less than a hundred years later, in 1665, the Great Plague killed around one-third of the remaining population. During the English Civil War, the economy of Norfolk suffered somewhat. During the Industrial Revolution Norfolk did not develop much of any industry. The railway system also came rather late to it. The economy bounced back during the Second World War when agriculture rapidly intensified. The economy remains primarily agrarian even today.


Parish Councillor Needed

Mobile Library van

As you may remember there was a consultation on if the Mobile Library van should continue. In January 2023 the final decision was made by Norfolk County Council Cabinet on the future of the mobile library service. They are preparing to decommission one mobile library and continue to operate five vehicles, and an electric mini mobile, due to for commission later this year. In accordance with the key principles agreed by Members, Norfolk Library and Information Service will cease the majority of stops that happen within 1.5 miles of a branch library.

Fortunately for Ingham our Village Hall is 2 miles away from the library in Stalham, therefore the monthly visits will continue.

The mobile library will visit the Village Hall car park on Wednesdays at 16.30 for 20 minutes each month. We will continue to publish the monthly dates as per usual.

Dear Friends

When I was in the brownies we used to sing this little song:

'Make new friends, but keep the old; one is silver and the other gold.'

Friends are such a gift, there with us to share in the joys and laughter. They're also there for us when things aren't going so well. They're the people who we don't quite get round to seeing for months, and then we slip comfortably right back in to one another's presence. 

Sea Palling Independent Lifeboat

Its been a while since we provided an update as we've been working very hard to get both the new boat, Cannon Portal, and our new rescue vehicle, an eight wheeler Argocat, up to the required standards and ensuring the crew are familiar with them. The Argocat has now been fully equipped with a roof rack to accommodate a full size rescue stretcher, carries a full first aid kit, and a tactical stretcher. This is used if we are required to move someone very quickly due to oncoming dangers. We've also had to undertake additional work within the station to accommodate Cannon Portal.

Our beach stall is set up most Sunday mornings, tide permitting, so why not come down and say hello to the crew.

Our annual Lifeboat Day is on Sunday 13 August 11.00 - 15.00 hrs, look out for more information on our social media pages shortly. If you wish to donate a prize for the raffle please contact us, or drop it off at the station Sunday mornings.



The Night Sky in July



The Summer Triangle is now back in the sky in full glory. As these three stars are among the brightest ones in the summer sky, they are usually the first ones you can see after the Sun has set. The chart above is for 11pm in the middle of the month. Why don't give it a try on a clear night and see if you can find Deneb, Lyra, and Altair in the eastern sky? If you have spotted them once, it gets easier every time. Impress your friends by pointing out three stars and naming them as well!

Have you noticed that currently the brightest part of the sky at night is in the north? Normally you would expect the west to be light after sunset and the east just before dawn. But in the summer months the Sun wanders just below the northern horizon from the west to the east, so that the northern sky is lit throughout the night and the southern part is much darker.
