



Recipe of the month from Alistair Wright

Winter Warmer Soup

This is a quickly made seasonal vegetable soup.

Preparation time: 20 mins

Cooking time: approx 30/45 mins.

Ingredients

A handful of pearl barley(soaked in water 40 mins before cooking and drained a couple of times)

2 Onions

2 Carrots

1 large Maris Piper potato

2 cloves of garlic

2 parsnips

Handful of Falafel pasta

Splash of mixed herbs spice

Splash of salt and pepper

Curry powder approx 2 teaspoons or to taste

Method

- Peel the potato, carrots, onions, and parsnips, cut everything into small approx 1cm chunks and add to a reasonably large saucepan.
- Add cold water so everything is just covered (you may need to top up the water during cooking).
- Bring just to the boil and then reduce heat to a simmer, cook until vegetables are just turning soft, turn off the heat and let it sit for a short while.
- Cooked meat can be added during cooking if you require.



The Night Sky in February

Aaaand... back again! This month I want to talk a bit about the Moon. In February we will have two "special" Moons, one of which will be visible and the other one not. On the 9th we will have a "Super New Moon" and on the 24th a "Micro Full Moon".

The orbit of the Moon around the Earth is not completely circular, it is an ellipse. That means that there are times when the Moon is farther away from us than at other times. The point on the orbit where the Moon is closest is called "perigee" and the one where it is farthest away is called "apogee".

If a Full or New Moon is near its closest distance (perigee), it is called a "Super Moon". If it is the farthest away (apogee) it is called a "Micro Moon". The reason for this is of course that the Full Moon looks 14% bigger and 30% brighter at perigee than at apogee. Unfortunately, if it's a Super New Moon, like this month, you won't be able to see it at all because it is very close to the Sun in the day sky.

There is no astronomical definition for these descriptions, but most people would say that a Super Moon is closer than 360,000 km and a Micro Moon is further away than 405,000 km. The average distance between Earth and Moon is 382,900 km.

In the next three months you can observe the Moon in a close approach to Jupiter. This will happen on the 14th February, the 13th March, and the 10th April. Look for it in the evening sky towards the south west. If you have a camera with a long lens it will be a nice opportunity to catch both objects in the same picture. Whatever you do, do yourself the favour and get out after sunset to enjoy watching the close encounter of Moon and Jupiter.
