News from Holy Trinity Church

Hello, I am Darleen Plattin, your newly appointed Rector

It was suggested that I should write and tell you something about myself and my Journey so far.

Norfolk is my home county, I grew up in Great Ryburgh, I spent my earlier working life in Cromer. I was confirmed in St. Mary's Northrepps in 1988. After three years at OakHill Theological College I moved to Gloucestershire. Eventually Norfolk drew me back in 2000.

Before ordination I worked for NNVS, initially involved with a project encouraging people with special support needs to volunteer, and latterly as Human Resources Manager.

After 3 years ordination training with ERMC I was ordained Deacon in Norwich Cathedral in June 2007 and priested there in June 2008. I served my Curacy in the Barnham Broom team and in 2010 became Priest in Charge of the Easton Benefice, 4 parishes east of Norwich, and Chaplain to Diocesan House. In 2014 I was appointed Priest in Charge of the Gt Plumstead Benefice. In 2018 two thirds of the Plumstead benefice was merged with Salhouse and Rackheath to form the Bittern Benefice of which I have served as Rector for the past seven years. As someone who grew up in the countryside I am very much at home in rural ministry and you will discover that I have a fondness for sheep. I am passionate about the relationship between Church and School. I love going into school to do collective worship and have been a school governor for many years, and served as a member of the Diocesan Board of Education.

There are two of us in residence at the Rectory, the second being a ten year-old patterdale called Lottie, and no, she isn't a Labrador with short legs. Do come and say hello if you see us out for walkies.

One of the most exciting aspects of ministry is being able to share something of God's love with people whatever their situation, and pointing them on the road to discovering God's abundant grace for themselves.

I'm looking forward to this next part of the journey and to sharing and walking it with you. I hope over the next few weeks and months I shall have the opportunity to meet many of you and get to discover something about you, so that together we can learn something of God's love for us.

I am always happy to discuss requests for Baptisms, Weddings, and Blessings after civil services.
